Program Overview



What have we done to date?

- Deployment of Wood Duck boxes and nesting structures.
- Invasive species eradication and education, through purple loosestrife beetle projects and boot cleaning stations.
- Clearing projects for brush control, habitat restoration or ease of public access and safety.
- Maintenance projects like repainting gates with high visibility yellow.
- Parking lot clean-ups.
- Wetland and lake clean-ups.
- Education through project reports via email, social media, and our website www.wisducks.org.
- Waterfowl identification panels on public lands.
- Helping with signage maintenance like closed areas for hunting.
- Experimental projects like floating nesting platforms for black terns.
- Grant application writing for nesting island restoration and wetland restoration, with our first AWA focused grant approved in August of 2018 for Lake Mills Wildlife Area.

 - Rome Pond WA




Chain Saw Training














Purple Loosestrife Project
