Agenda:

- Financial Report
 - Still behind, but not as bad as forecast.
 - May finish year in the black.

• Executive Director's Report

- WWA events that have executed this year have gone well.
- Remaining events this year should bring in \$130k.
- Staff compensation has been adjusted.
 - -- Rob Monette has been hired as the full-time RD
 - -- Tom Seibert is working part-time as the Class A raffle specialist.

• Habitat Update

- Peter Ziegler provided an overview of habitat projects; with two projects completed for the year and seven more pending.

-- Some may have to wait for a freeze.

- Twelve project applications on deck, with six expected to work out (approx. 60 acres of habitat).

- Rice seedings have hit a snag due to covid; Peter won't be able to engage with schools.

-- Rice seedings still planned for Forest and Juneau Counties.

- The idea of a Wild Rice Coordinator has not been implemented due to the sporadic nature of groups interested in rice planting.

- Though WWA is receiving more project inquiries, it still needs more projects in the pipeline.

-- Need to touch new people.

- Need to expand funding sources to private foundations.

• Waterfowl Hunters Expo

- Steering group is starting to gel.
- Winnebago County Fairgrounds selected as the location.
- Date of Expo to be August 28, 2021.
- Marketing push next; survery to be sent out.

• Policy Updates

- George Ermert expressed our goal is to get the duck stamp increase in the Governor's budget.

-- A meeting was held with the Deputy Chief of Staff, who is the point-person for the Governor's budget.

-- Deputy Chief of Staff was non-commital.

-- Next is to have Zoom meetings with Democratic legislators to push the duck stamp into the Governor's budget.

-- After duck stamp makes it into the budget, WWA will beging outreach to Republican legislators.

- Push to reauthorize the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship program for ten years.

- -- It will end this legislative year unless reauthorized.
- -- Governor's office supports it with robust funding.

-- Blowback from some Republicans as it is expensive and quite a bit of debt is coming due.

-- WWA will be a signator on a letter form Gathering Waters advocating for reauthorization.

- Sandhill Crane season will be a difficult issue.

- -- Farmers' board asked NRB to look into a season.
- -- Two different working-groups formed to explore a season.

• Social Media and Policy Update

- The WWA Facebook page has seen a 12% increase (from 2500 to 2900) in followers since April; as well as a 12% increase in "likes".

- Russell Moccasin and Lucky Duck are sharing WWA posts.
- Facebook is free advertising.

• Committee Restructuring

- Uneven progress on committees.
- -- Habitat Committee meeting frequently.
- -- Some committees not meeting at all.
- -- Policy Committee doing good work but has not reached the grass-roots level.
- Board meetings not frequent enough as some directors feel left out of the loop.
- Board Composition
 - Discussion of just what WWA expects of board members.
